1. Robinson, Ebenezer; Don Carlos Smith, Joseph Smith, and John Taylor (Editors).

Times and Seasons

Nauvoo: Robinson & Smith; Joseph Smith; John Taylor and Wilford Woodruff; John Taylor, November, 1839 - February, 1846.



Six volumes (131 numbers) bound as four (1-2, 3-4, 5, 6) 958; 383; [384]-767; [768]-1135pp. Octavos [23 cm.] Volumes 1-5 bound in later 3/4 brown leather over marbled boards, with gilt stamped titles on the backstrips, and red speckled edges. Volume 6 bound in modern black cloth over boards, with the title and single ruled borders in gilt on the backstrip. The extremities are a bit dinged and rubbed. The underlying boards are exposed occasionally along the edges. Most of the facsimile plate at p. 721 in Volume III, Number 10, is absent. The pages have very occasional open tears in the margins, causing only minor loss to the text. There are losses, measuring 2" wide by 2 1/2" deep, from the top fore-edge corners of pp. 738-

741, which have resulted in more significant loss to the text. The pages of volumes 3 and 4 have light tide marks here and there, with the most prominent tide marks on the 336-383. Several pages in Volume 5 contain trivial marginalia. Volume 1, number 1, is the third state, with "Ptevail" and a date of "Nov. 1839." Volume 1, Numbers 2 and 3, are second state printings, with "Terms" in capital letters with open face type. [53854] **\$50,000**


This is the entire run of the influential Nauvoo newspaper. Originally edited by Ebenezer Robinson and Don Carlos Smith (Joseph's brother). Upon the death of his brother, Joseph became editor. The "Times and Seasons" was the official newspaper of the L.D.S. Church, and between its pages were the first appearances of the Wentworth Letter, the Book of Abraham, as well as the personal history of Joseph Smith. Also present, in Whole No. 96, is the account of the assassination of Joseph and Hyrum Smith.

One cannot hope to understand the Nauvoo period of Mormonism without the "Times and Seasons." More than its predecessors, it captures the spirit of the Latter-day Saints as it chronicles their day-to-day efforts to spread their message and gather the converted. Its pages reflect the optimism which fueled the building of the City of Joseph and the sorrow which accompanied its abandonment. Crawley 60. Flake/Draper 8955. Scallawagiana 16. Streeter 2271. Volumes of the original Journal of Discourses published between 1854 and 1886 are very scarce and complete sets are virtually unobtainable. The Journal of Discourses was replaced by the Biannual Conference Reports.





Originally, this volume was only intended for Whitney's children, and never intended for public consumption. Prior to his death it was distributed to family and friends. Scarce. Flake/Draper 9788.

Torpedo, or Torpedo 1936, is a Spanish comics series that focuses on ruthless hitman Luca Torelli. It takes place within the organized crime culture of New York City during the Great Depression. There is not much of a linear timeline, and there are few recurring characters besides Torelli, his Polish-American sidekick

Rascal, and a high-profile prostitute named Susan who frequently gets the better of Torelli.


Torpedo 1936 was first published in issue 32 of the Spanish horror comics magazine Creepy in February, 1982. The first two stories were drawn by veteran artist Alex Toth, who developed the series with Abulí, but Thoth and Abulí had creative differences regarding the series' dark humor and profanity, so Thoth left the project and was replaced by Bernet who worked with Abulí through the rest of the series' duration.

Torpedo went on to be featured in several Spanish comics magazines, such as Thriller, Comix International, Totem el Comix, Co & Co, and Viñetas. The series gained much public acclaim and was translated into many languages. In 1986 a Torpedo album won the Angoulême Best Foreign Album Award, and in May, 1991 a dedicated magazine named Luca Torelli es Torpedo began publication.

This two-volume boxed set brings Charles Schulz's Peanuts into their fourth decade. The eighties are a


lesser-known time period for the strip, but eventful situations take place, such as Charlie Brown's month-long hospitalization wherein he questions whether he has died and nobody has told him. Peppermint Patty finds herself in cornrows, witnesses the "butterfly miracle," enlists Snoopy as a lawyer to help her with a leaky ceiling, becomes romantically involved with Pig-Pen. Snoopy is up to his old tricks, donning an array of disguises including his world-famous surveyor, census taker, and blackjack player. He launches an ill-fated airline with the help of Lucy as agent, Linus as baggage handler, and Marcy as flight attendant. A little girl bird named Harriet is introduced, Snoopy's brother Marbles shows up, and "Crybaby" Boobie and Molly Volley make an appearance. Linus protests that he is not Sally's "Sweet Baboo." Charlie Brown joins Peppermint Patty's baseball team and has his baseball field taken away. The Van Pelts get into farming, and Spike is drafted into Snoopy's imaginary World War I Army.

These two books are part of a twenty-four volume collection (published from 2004-2015) released by Fantagraphics and designed by famed graphic novelist Seth.

The two pieces in this book originally came out in The New Yorker. With the tipped-in dedication page before the half-title.






An attractive replica of the first edition of Kerouac's On the Road.

Some very minor soiling and wear, overall in very good condition. There is a 2 inch crack in the front board at the head of the spine along the joint. Notations in pencil on the verso of the front free endsheet. The pages have very occasional light stains. The large stains measure 3 and 1/2 inches wide by 2 inches tall. The pages at the beginning are lightly soiled. There is a contemporary notation on the last page of the text. [28811] **\$1,250**



This is the second, expanded, printing in French, containing additional material. Sixty-seven illustrated plates including frontis. Jacques de Bie was a Flemish engraver. In 1636 he also published La France metallique.

Volume in the acclaimed Signature Books diary series. This edition is limited to five hundred copies, of which this is copy number 174. Smith was a member of the Quorum of the Twelve, and a General Authority in Joseph F. Smith's Presidency, after the death of John R. Winder. Smith was also the Chair of the Utah Constitutional Convention. From the publisher- "Jean

Bickmore White has a long-standing interest in Utah political history. She holds an M.A. degree from the University of California at Los Angeles and a Ph.D. degree from the University of Utah, both in political science. While writing her dissertation on Utah politics in the 1890s, she first read John Henry Smith's extensive journals and letters and recognized their importance in understanding the politics of that period in Utah history. A professor of political science at Weber State University since 1969, she has published articles and book reviews in the Utah Historical Quarterly, Dialogue: A Journal of Mormon Thought, Weber Studies, the Journal of the Mormon History, and the Charles Redd Center Monograph Series."
