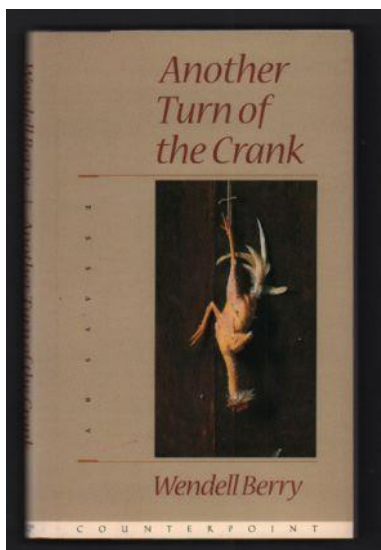
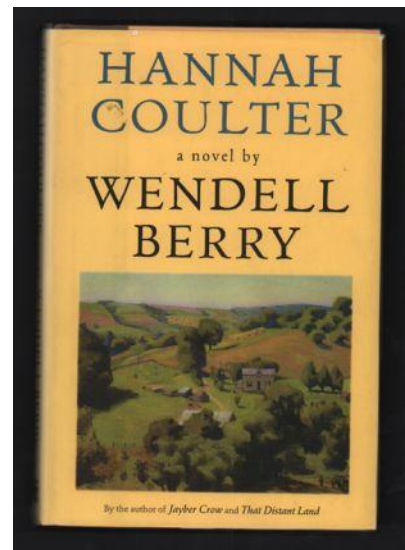

1. Berry, Wendell. **Hannah Coulter**. Washington DC: Shoemaker Hoard, 2004. First edition.

SIGNED. 190pp. Octavo [23.5 cm] 1/4 brown paper with yellow paper covered boards. The spine ends are bumped, and there is a small area of light staining to the fore-edge of the text block. In a dust jacket with occasional areas of moderate soiling, and a couple of shallow closed tears in the lightly creased edges. [53592] **\$100**

Another installment in Berry's story about the citizens of Port William, Hannah Coulter examines the effect of World War II on a small town and how one woman, Hannah Coulter, deals with the loss of her husband and determines to carry on. Wendell Berry is the author of over forty books of fiction, poetry, and essays. He has received the T. S. Eliot Award, the Aiken Taylor Award for poetry, and the John Hay Award of the Orion Society. This copy is signed by Wendell Berry on the title page.



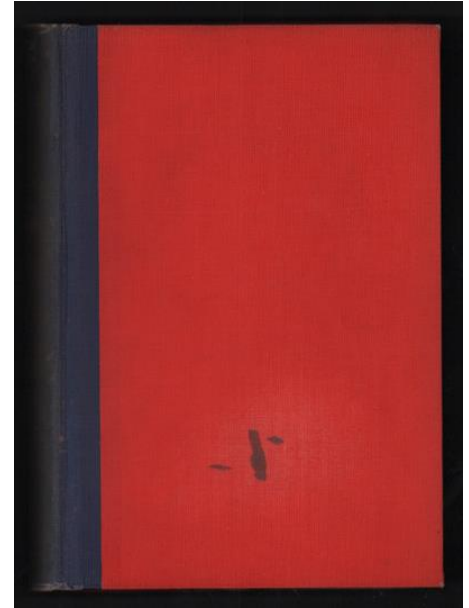

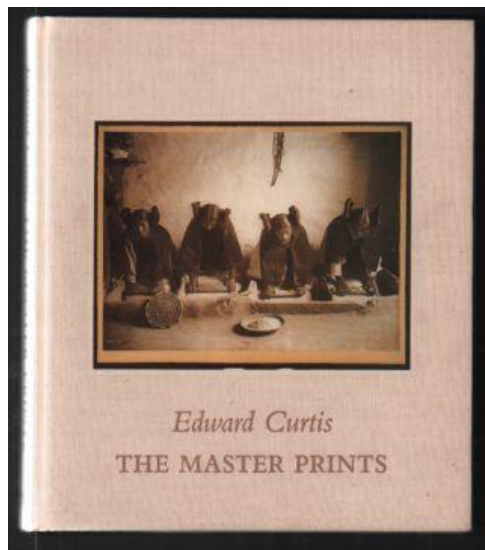

3. Cather, Willa. **The Professor's House**. New York: Alfred A. Knopf, 1925. First trade edition.

SIGNED. 283pp. Octavo [20 cm] Orange cloth boards with blue cloth spine. Publisher's orange top stain. No dust jacket. The front board has several small ink stains, and it appears as though someone has subtly tried to rub them out. The spine is rolled, the cloth backstrip is foxed, and the title has faded. The front hinge is a bit soft, and there is a bookseller's ticket on the front free endpaper. Overall, the book is very sturdy. A novel in which a 52-year-old Midwestern small-town professor gradually becomes disinterested with life, and one in which the house itself plays a key symbolic role, reflecting the character of its protagonist. Cather describes the house at the opening of the novel, as "almost as ugly as it is possible for a house to be." This is a later novel from the author which magnificently crystallizes the prominent themes seen in her earlier works, such as the endurance and acceptance of suffering. Signed trade editions are scarce. This copy is signed by Willa Cather on the title page.

The opening publication of the Bollingen Series. With revisions and a new preface. Presents Maude Oakes' versions of the Navaho pollen-paintings. A Blessing Ceremonial, stemming from a Navaho Creation myth, which was given to Maud Oakes by Jeff King, a Medicine Man, and recorded for the first time when it was originally published in 1944.

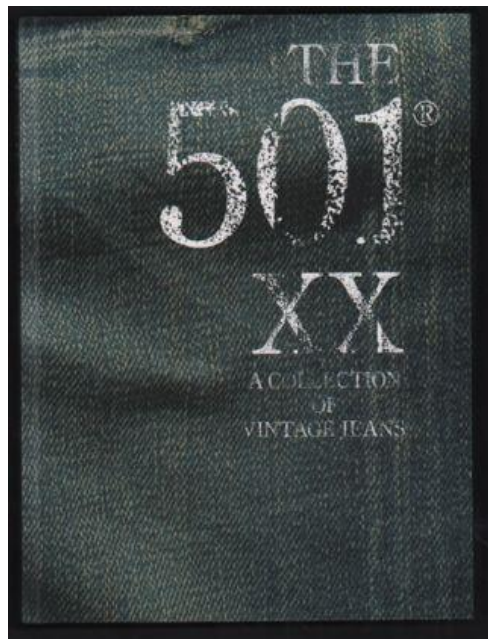
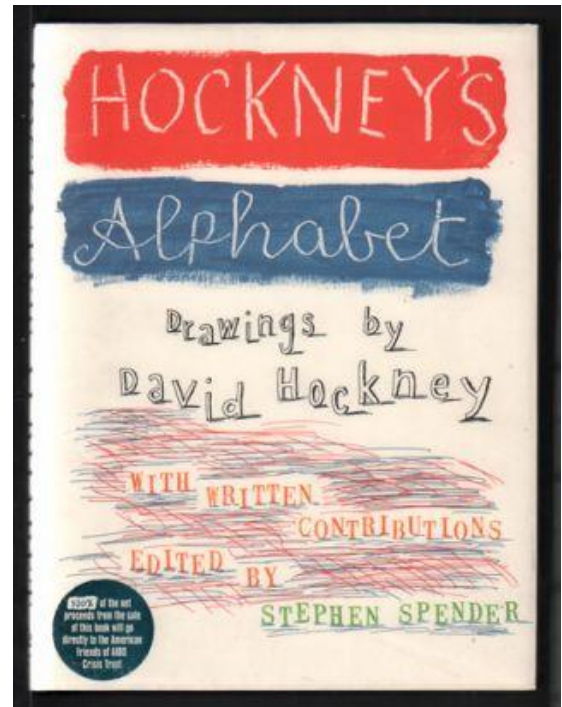

Denim was originally workwear, but through over 100 years, it was integrated into our daily life, developing into part of fashion and finally becoming a culture that is accepted by everyone from children to adults. Today, luckily enough, many valuable vintage clothing items

can be found in the market of Japan. Then I started to wonder, among them, how many 501 XX Jeans exist in the country. As one of the Japanese people who discovered their worth, this motivated me to make a photo book to introduce the vintage jeans."



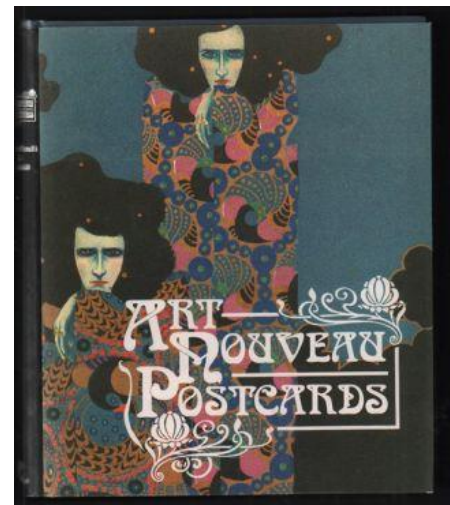

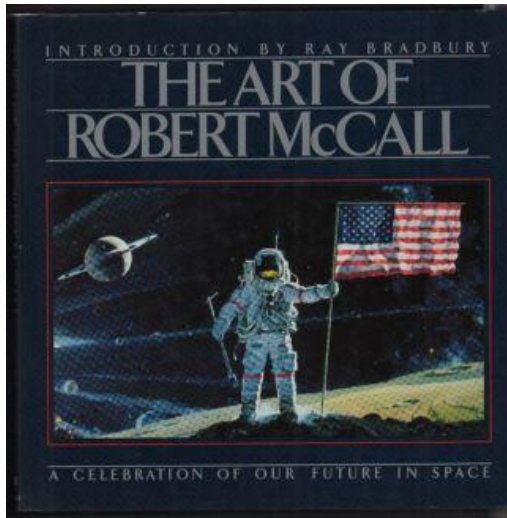

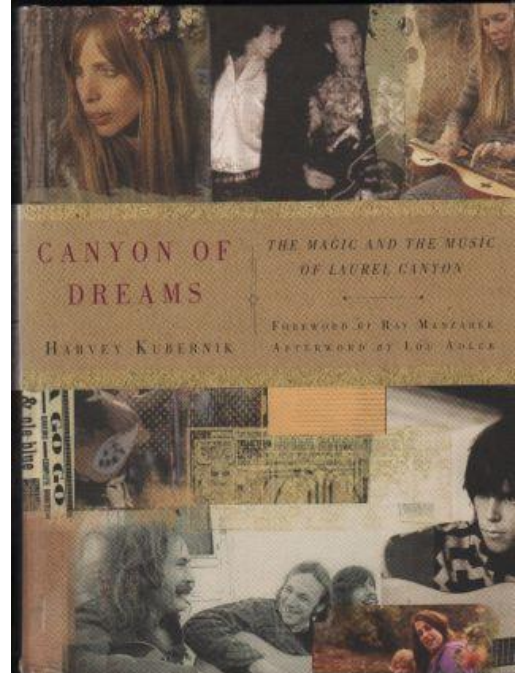

George Louis Leclerc, Comte de Buffon, was a French naturalist, mathematician, cosmologist, and encyclopédiste, whose works influenced the succeeding two generations of naturalists. Buffon's Histoire Naturelle is a 44-volume encyclopedia which described everything known at the time about the natural world, and even speculated about similarities between humans and apes roughly a century before Darwin.
